Harry



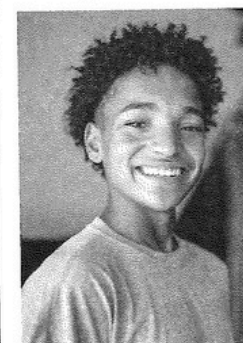

Sisters Melati and Isabel live on the Indonesian island of Bali. Bali is very popular with tourists, who go there for its beautiful beaches.
